This collection is one of the finest of the coins of the United States that has ever been offered, on account of the completeness of the series represented and the superlative condition of the specimens. It equals in quality and interest our previous large sales of the Bushnell, Cleaney and Winsor collections. How rarely such a cabinet comes upon the market may be appreciated when we remember that it is over eight years since the sale of the Winsor collection.

This collection contains the Sommer Island X1I, VI, II pence; fifty pieces of Massachusetts silver; Lord Baltimore coins ; the unique Continental currency dollar in silver; early coins of the United States; Washington coins ; coins of the States, including a fine series of Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New York and New Jersey; coins of the United States after the establishment of the Mint; series of eagles, 1795 to 1804 ; quarter eagles; gold dollars; silver dollars, 1794 very fine, 1836 with Cobrecht signature in field, 1838-1839-1851-1852-; half dollars; quarter dollars ; dimes; half dimes ; cents ; and half cents; all in the finest state of preservation, including all the rarities with one or two exceptions. We have prepared a catalogue in quarto size, with broad margins and fine paper, in the style of our previous catalogues of the Bushnell, Cleaney, Warner and Winsor collections, etc., and on account of the cost of presenting the catalogue in this fine style, and to save waste, it is necessary for us to make a small charge for them, as in the previous instances above mentioned, of 50 cents for plain catalogue. This is not done to make a profit, as the price will just about cover the cost of postage, fifteen cents, the paper and binding, and we feel that as we are giving very full descriptions, so that it will form a work of reference, that the collectors receive more than value for their money. It might be mentioned that this is also the practice at the sale of large libraries.

They represent 272 coins with their obverses and reverses, except one, which therefore equal 543 representations of coins, the largest number that has ever before been placed on a plate catalogue in this country.

We have abandoned the autotype process, as it was unsatisfactory and too uncertain, and employed that which we had in view in 1895 for the Brown collection, when the ignorant Treasury officials extended the law on counterfeiting to include the publication of Numismatic books and stopped our issuance of the plates for that collection; but last year the Senior member of the firm, single handed, secured the passage through Congress of an amendment to this law, exempting Numismatic books and circulars of legitimate dealers, and we are now again able to give the distant collector the opportunity of seeing with his own eyes, exact photographic images of the coins, and a perpetual visual record of the collection. By this process we have secured finer work with absolutely perfect detall, than has heretofore been the result from any of the autotype processes. Collectors may use high power magnifying glasses, in fact we would advise the use of a large reading glass in looking at the plates and which could not be used on the autotype or half tone methods of printing. We believe we have finer results than have ever been published of photographs of coins. To obtain the white back-ground which has heretofore been used, it was necessary to paint out on the negative, the original surface surrounding the coins and the perfection of the outline of every coin depended on the care and steadiness of the hand that did the brush work. We have also abandoned this method of working and the coins are shown with their own original edges.

## PREFACE.

In this catalogue of the collection of John (i. Mills, Esq., of Albany, New York, we describe one of the finest collections of the coins of the United States that has ever been offered at publie sale. Mr. Mills, bor'n in Albany, Jnly 19, 1865, and one of the younger collectors, has devoted a great part of his time during the past twenty years to the formation of this superb collection, and it is to be regretted that he has conchuded to dispose of it, yet on the other hand, it will give other mumismatists an opportunity of enjoying the possession of the beantiful specimens whieh it contains.

They have nearly all came from famous cabinets and as Mr. Mills has in nearly every ease preserved the pedigree of previous ownership as it may be termed, we have stated them in many instances in our catalogne. It is important to do so, not only on acconnt of the examples themselves, but to prevent the feeling arising in the minds of collectors that additional specimens are appearing when they are the same pieces that have been known in previous collections.

The collection contains specimens of the highest rarity and in the finest states of preservation in every series represented, and to review them here would be but a repetition of the entire catalogue. The greatest rarity and the chief piece of the collection, is the 1766 Continental Currency dollar in silver. The other principal pieces are the sommers Island pieees, the Massachnsetts silver which slightly exceeds in number any series heretofore offered, inchenges the N. E. shilling; the Lord Baltimore coins in silver; 1792 Washington half dollar in silver, the rarity of which in its proper metal has not been heretofore appreciated; New York cents; rare Eagles and Quarter Eagles; 1794 silver dollar which is one of the finest known ; 1796 half dollar; 1804 quarter dollar uncirculated ; 1827 original proof; many rare and exquisite dimes and half dimes ; cents of $1793,1794,1795,1796,1804,1821$, 1823 perfect die; the original half cents of $1 \times 31,1836,1840$ to 18.52.

At the end of the catalogue will be found a few Greek and Roman coins and a series of recent Foreign silver coins.

The coins are nearly all in the finest state of preservation and we have carefully graded them in our usual regular degrees of preservation ; proof, uncirculated, extremely fine (showing only the faintest touch, just so as not to be uncirculated), very fine, fine, very good, good, fair, poor. When silver coins are described as uncirculated, they retain their mint lustre.

We issue this catalogue at a uniform charge of 50 c . for each copy and with priced list sent after the sale $\$ 1$. We have also issued an edition illustrated with fourteen plates, representing the principal coins at $\$ 5$; and as there is much variety in the Massachusetts silver, we hare placed the entire collection on them.
